Re: AB 37 (O'Donnell) Pupil Instruction: visual and performing arts: content standards in media arts (As Enrolled July 6, 2017)

Dear Governor Brown:

On behalf of the California Alliance for Arts Education I am writing to express our support for AB 37 (O'Donnell), legislation that would establish visual and performing arts standards in the subject of media arts, and require those recommendations to go through the same development, public review, and approval process for recommended revisions to other visual and performing arts content standards.

We recognize that the advance of technology in all forms is redefining the process of creating and responding to the arts and all forms of "media". The learning opportunities schools provide need to adapt and evolve to stay current and relevant for young people.

Student learning standards are only one essential element for instructional delivery. It is also important to establish clarity and alignment between teacher preparation programs, subject matter credentials, curriculum development, course offerings, CTE career pathways, and university admission requirements. It is our hope that the further development of media arts as a content area will be done in a collaborative fashion, drawing on the expertise and contributions of all arts disciplines.


We support this bill, and we respectfully request your signature on this measure.
