

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Background

- California used to have single-subject credentials in Dance and Theatre
- Twice before this legislation was passed and vetoed by the Governor

- Only two states do not have credentials in Dance and Theatre
- Dance and Theatre are in the Ed Code with discrete standards

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Projected Timeline

- January 27, 2016: SB 916 introduced by Senator Ben Allen (D-Santa Monica)
- April 1, 2016: Send your emails to your CTA reps
- April 8, 2016: State Council for the California Teachers Association (CTA) meets

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CTA Structure

YOU

The CTA Member

YOUR SCHOOL



Local Union Site Rep

Elected at your school to represent your site at your District Rep Council meetings

YOUR DISTRICT



Local Union President

Presides over the Executive Board of your local union; President and Board are elected by the teachers in your District

District Rep Council

All Site Reps from Your District; they meet together once a month

State Council Reps

Members of your local union Exec Board elected to represent it at the CTA State Council meetings twice each year

CALIFORNIA



State Council

State level CTA meeting with representatives attending from all districts; has many committees, including Credentials and Professional Development Committee

CTA President and Executive Board

Decide on actions to take on behalf of the membership based on recommendations coming from each State Council Committee
